BEESTON REGIS PC Action Plan 2020/2021

Following the Meeting of Beeston Regis Parish Council on Wednesday 13th November the Action Plan for 2020/21 was agreed as follows

- 1 To continue to promote a scheme for Community Led Housing should an exception site be identified by the Parish council
- 2 To interact with North Norfolk District Council on all relevant matters, in particular the formulation of the new Local Plan, and any matters related to Government's Localism Agenda.
- 3 To engage with Runton Parish Council following the new Ward of Beeston Regis and Runtons established in 2019
- 4 To continue to meet the requirements of the Quality status awarded in 2018 under the Local Council Award Scheme
- 5 To engage further with the children of the parish and again organize a Beeston Regis afternoon at Hilltop Activity Park for them Budget £100
- 6 Following the installation of a vehicle activated speed sign used at various designated locations within the parish to look at any other relevant traffic issues which may be eligible for a Grant from the Norfolk County Council.
- 7 To maintain an overview of Highways, Bridleways and Footpath matters within and around Beeston Regis particularly with Norfolk County Council which body has responsibility
- 8 To continue to improve the appearance and tidiness of the parish including general maintenance of Parish assets .To organize regular litter picks and to propose work for the Norfolk County Council Rangers, or such other body Budget: Assets £ 200 Bus Shelters £960
- 9 To continue to seek out ideas from the local community for the future use of Daisy Green.
- 10 To further develop public awareness and public knowledge of the important Priory Ruins. To encourage religious services at the Ruins. To engage with English Heritage and the Norfolk Historic Buildings Trust when appropriate
- 11 To attend meetings of the North Norfolk District Council Coastal Issues Forum To engage with Beeston Regis Holiday Park the owners of the Council's coastline with regard to the Coastal Access path and the access steps to the Beach.
- 12 To develop our Community Engagement Strategy through such channels as social media, parish council website, notice boards and newsletters and personal contact To continue to

provide opportunities and encouragement for all parishioners to attend meetings and make contact with their parish council in as many ways as possible. To further enhance the Beeston Regis Parish Council's website.

To respond to issues resulting from the Parish Questionnaire delivered to all households in October 2019

Together with Beeston Regis Holiday Park to carry out a Parish Questionnaire in respect of the "second home" static lodges and caravans on Beeston Regis Holiday Park

To continue printing of Beeston Regis News Budget £50

- 13 To engage with the important businesses in Beeston Regis particularly but not restricted to Beeston Hall School, Norfolk Gravel, Hilltop Activity Centre, Beeston Regis Holiday Park, Anglia Mowers and The Priory Maze & Gardens
- 14 To maintain our involvement in the work of All Saints Church, local groups, charities and societies including the West Runton Scout Group, the Sheringham and District Society and the Hooke and Unknown Donor Charities.
- 15 To continue to promote the Hooke and Unknown Donor Charities
- 16 To continue our representation on the Sheringham and District Safer Neighbourhood Team (SNAP).
- 17 To continue to improve good governance through the identification of efficiencies and modern methods of working.
- 18 To scrutinize planning applications and associated matters and comment accordingly including the discouragement of light pollution for the development of the Darker Skies initiative.

To continue our responsibilities in respect of the Area of Outstanding Natural Beauty, and the Conservation Area falling within the parish.

- 19 To prepare for any national or local commemoration in 2020 of the 75th anniversary of the ending of WW2 in Europe and Japan Budget £200
- 20~To organize Merchant Navy Day Celebration with All Saints Church in September 2020 . Budget. $\pounds 30$
- 21 To maintain and monitor the defibrillator in the decommissioned telephone box, owned by the council, in conjunction with the Community Heartbeat Trust.
- 22 To work with Norfolk Gravel to object to installation of right hand third lane turn at the southern end of Britons Lane for traffic coming from the east.

To further engage with Norfolk County Council for signage directing traffic to Beeston Regis via the A1082 and A149 and not via Britons Lane.

To support the possible construction of a roundabout at the junction of the A148 and the A1082 which may lead to a reduction of traffic using Britons Lane

- 23 In conjunction with Sanders Coaches to facilitate the delivery of up to date timetables of buses serving Beeston Regis and the surrounding area.
- 24 To consider a memorial seat and garden on the land at junction of Britons Lane and A149 To engage with Victory Housing Ltd regarding the future use and maintenance of this land
- 25 To engage with Sheringham Town Council regarding clearance of the surface water drainage ditch along side, but not forming part of, the western boundary of the Parish.
