WHAT'S HAPPENING IN YOUR AREA?

We have had a busy start to the year in the Sheringham area, officers have increased foot patrols as well as holding a number of digital engagement events to give members of the community covered by Sheringham Safer Neighbourhood Team an opportunity to speak directly to officers about any concerns or issues they have. Future digital engagement events will be advertised on the Constabulary's Facebook and Twitter sites.

Officers also carried out a number of warrants on addresses in Sheringham Town, this resulted in 3 people being arrested and a significant amount of Cannabis being seized. The equipment used to cultivate the cannabis was also dismantled and seized as part of the offence.

Our Safer Neighbourhood Team Priority Setting Meeting was held on Thursday 17th February and our new priorities can be seen below.

CRIME UPDATES (1st to 31st January)

Offence	Numbers	What could this entail
Arson	1	Damage caused as a result of fire.
Anti-Social Behaviour (ASB)	1	Harassment, alarm or distress is caused in a non-crime incident.
Burglary business and community	3	A person commits theft in a building or structure that is not lived in.
Burglary residential	0	Entry and theft in a building or a structure that is lived in.
Criminal Damage	8	A person destroys or damages property belonging to someone else.
Domestic	0	Domestic incidents where a crime has not occurred. Parties are aged 16 or over and have been intimate partners or family members regardless of sexuality.
Hate Incident	0	Any incident where a crime has not occurred which the victim, or anyone else, thinks is based on someone's prejudice towards them because of their race, religion, sexual orientation, disability or because they are transgender.
Race or Religious aggravated public fear	0	Any crime determined to have a hate element as per above.
Possession of controlled substance	1	Unlawful possession of a drug classified in class A, B or C.
Possession of weapons	0	Unlawful possession of an article used as a weapon.
Public fear, alarm or distress	3	Public order offences e.g. from a verbal altercation to offences just short of violence.
Robbery	0	Includes a range of offences where force is used, threatened or the victim is put in fear.
Theft from a motor vehicle	1	Any item stolen that was in, on or attached to a motor vehicle.
Theft or unauthorised taking of a motor vehicle	0	Any motor vehicle including those abandoned.
Theft of pedal cycle	0	From a public place, if stolen from a shed or garage this would be a BOTD.
Theft from a person	0	Purse being taken from a handbag, or a mobile phone from a shopping basket.
